PARKING

Please ensure you;

- Park safely a short distance from the school eg Morrisons or the Orbital Centre car park
- DO NOT park, or WAIT on the yellow "Keep Clear" markings. They are there to keep children safe.
- DO NOT park or block drop kerbs.
- DO NOT make U-Turns in Haydon Court Drive.

PSCO's are now regularly patrolling all areas around the school.

ATTENDANCE

School attendance is mandatory.

Public Health England and the Government's Chief Medical & Scientific Officers agree that there is a very low risk and rate of severe illness in children from COVID-19. School is the best place for your child to be. With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, children are now able to enjoy more freedom in their education. Being at school keeps children's education on track, so they can achieve their full potential, while also benefitting their mental and physical health and wellbeing. We are doing everything we can to ensure your child can continue to attend school.

What should I do if my child has COVID-19 symptoms?

If your child has any of the main COVID-19 symptoms (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste)

- They should not attend school and should stay at home.
- You should arrange for them to get a PCR test (an in-person test if possible not a postal test) and inform us of the result
- Your child should not attend school while you are waiting for test results, even if they are feeling better.
- If the test is negative, they should return to school as normal.
- If they test positive, they should continue to isolate and follow public health advice.

What happens if my child has been in contact with someone with COVID-19 symptoms? If your child has been identified as a close contact by NHS Test and Trace, you will be advised that your child takes a PCR test. They will not have to self-isolate whilst they await the result of the PCR test unless they develop symptoms; they will need to isolate if a positive PCR test.

DROP OFF/PICK UP

A polite reminder that parents/carers should navigate clockwise around the school in the morning and afternoon. Pupils should not be playing on any equipment before and after school to allow a swift drop off and pick up.

ABSENCE

I will not be granting any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Any request for leave must be made in writing. A response will be returned indicating whether the leave is authorised. Any absence not authorised may be liable to a local authority penalty notice.

Good attendance is key to pupils making good progress and taking time out to go on holiday can significantly hamper progress. Therefore, we request that no child takes holiday during term time

As we do not have a lost property box in school, please ensure all uniform is clearly named so it can be easily reunited with your child.




ALLERGIES
