

SKATE PARK

It has been brought to our attention that some of our children have been seen climbing trees, not showing respect to the environment and behaving in an irresponsible manner. Please can you remind your children, that if they use the skate park before and after school, they are representing Haydonleigh in the local community and they should behave in a considerate manner.

COVID

Updated information from the Government from 1 April. Regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting, including in SEND, alternative provision and children's social care settings.

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to attend.

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days
